What Does the Bible Say About God?

1. What is God?

THE BIBLE SAYS-

- (a) **John 4:24**. God is **Spirit**, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth.
- (b) *Exodus 3:14.* And God said to Moses, **I AM WHO I AM.** And He said, Thus you shall say to the children of Israel, **I AM** has sent me to you.
- (c) *Luke 24:39.* Behold My hands and My feet, that it is I Myself. Handle Me and see, for a spirit **does not have flesh and bones** as you see I have.
- (d) **John 1:18.** No one has seen God at any time. The only begotten Son, who is in the bosom of the Father, He has declared Him.

FROM THIS WE LEARN-

God is (A) a spirit, that is (B) a personal being (C) without flesh and blood, and therefore (D) invisible.

2. How is God?

THE BIBLE SAYS-

- (a) **Psalm 90:1,2.** LORD, You have been our dwelling place in all generations. Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever You had formed the earth and the world, even **from everlasting to everlasting**, You are God.
- (b) *Malachi 3:6.* For I am the LORD, I do not change...
- (c) Genesis 17:1. The LORD appeared to Abram and said to him, I am Almighty God...
- (c) Matthew 19:26. With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible.
- (d) **Psalm 139:1-4.** O LORD, You have searched me and **known me.** You **know my sitting down** and my rising up; you **understand my thought** afar off. You **comprehend my path** and my lying down, and are **acquainted with all my ways**. For there is not a word on my tongue, but behold, O LORD, **You know it altogether**.
- (e) *Jeremiah 23:24.* Can anyone hide himself in secret places, so I shall not see him? says the LORD; **Do I not fill heaven and earth**? says the LORD.
- (f) Leviticus 19:2. I the LORD your God am holy.
- (g) **Deuteronomy 32:4**. He is the Rock, His work is perfect; for all His ways are justice, a God of truth and without injustice; **righteous** and upright is He.
- (h) 2 Timothy 2:13. If we are faithless, he remains faithful; he cannot deny Himself.
- (i,j) **Psalm 145:9**. The LORD is **good** to all, and His **tender mercies** are over all His works.
- (j,k) *Exodus 34:6,7*. The LORD, the LORD God, **merciful and gracious**, **longsuffering**, and abounding in goodness and truth, keeping mercy for thousands, **forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin**...
- (k) 1 John 4:8. God is love.

FROM THIS WE LEARN-

God is

- (A) Eternal (without beginning and without end);
- (B) Unchangeable;
- (C) Omnipotent (almighty, all-powerful);
- (D) Omniscient (all-knowing);
- (E) Omnipresent (present everywhere);
- (F) Holy (sinless and hating sin);
- (G) Just (fair and impartial);
- (H) Faithful (keeping His promises);

- (I) Benevolent (good, kind, desiring our welfare);
- (J) Merciful (full of pity);
- (K) Gracious (showing undeserved kindness, forgiving).

3. Who is the only true God?

THE BIBLE SAYS-

- (a) **Deuteronomy 6:4**. Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is **one!**
- *(b) *Matthew 28:19.* Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the **Father** and of the **Son** and of the **Holy Spirit**.
- (b) **2** Corinthians 13:14. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God (Father), and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. Amen.
- (b) *Numbers6:24-26.* The **LORD** bless you and keep you; the **LORD** make His face shine upon you, and be gracious to you; the **LORD** lift up His countenance upon you, and give you peace.
- (b) *Matthew 3:16,17*. When He had been baptized, **Jesus** came up immediately from the water; and behold, the heavens were opened to Him, and He saw the **Spirit of God** descending like a dove and alighting upon Him. And suddenly a **voice came from heaven**, saying, **This is My beloved Son**, in whom I am well pleased.
- (c) *John 10:30*. I (Jesus) and My Father are one.
- (c) 1 John 5:7. For there are three that bear witness in heaven: the Father, the Word, and the Holy Spirit; and these three are one.

FROM THIS WE LEARN-

- (A) God is one ("une").
- (B) In this one God there are three ("tri") distinct Persons, namely the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- (C) The true God is the Triune God.
 (The Father sent the Son to be our Savior, the Son redeemed us with His sufferings, and death; the Holy Spirit brings us to saving faith in Jesus Christ.)

4. With what attitude of heart are we to contemplate the mystery of the Holy Trinity? THE BIBLE SAYS-

- (a,b) 1 Corinthians 2:11. For what man knows the things of a man except the spirit of the man which is in him? Even so no one knows the things of God except the Spirit of God.
- (a,b) *1 Timothy 6:16.* Who (God) alone has immortality, dwelling in **unapproachable** light, whom **no man has seen or can see**, to whom be honor and everlasting power. Amen.
- (a,b) **John 1:18**. **No one has seen God** at any time. The only begotten Son, who is in the bosom of the Father, **He has declared Him**.
 - (c) *Revelation 4:8*. And they (inhabitants of heaven) do not rest day or night, saying: Holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come!

FROM THIS WE LEARN-

- (A) The doctrine of the Holy Trinity is far beyond our reason; it is therefore altogether unreasonable to try to fathom it, or to reject it because we cannot do so.
- (B) Only God knows God, and He has revealed Himself to us, through Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit, in the Bible, as the Triune God.
- (C) We are to accept this revelation of Himself with unquestioning faith, and to adore and glorify Him with the hosts of heaven.

5. What does it mean to believe in God?

THE BIBLE SAYS-

- (a) **John 17:3**. And this is eternal life, that they may **know** You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent.
- (b) **James 1:21.** Receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls.

(c) Psalm 31:14. I trust in You, O LORD; I say, You are my God.
FROM THIS WE LEARN-
To believe in God means that, on the basis of the Scriptures, I personally, in my heart,
(A) Know God as my gracious God in Christ Jesus; (Knowledge.)(B) Accept as true what He says and promises; (Assent.)
(C) Trust in Him and rely on Him with firm confidence. (Confidence.)
